Sept. 14th, 2011 my husband and I along with Mary Lou Maxwell and her husband, Don, had our first meeting with Isaiah 61 Ministries. We had come on Wednesday evening to bring 20 sleeping mats to folks who needed them. What a surprise we had seeing so many people lined up for a meal. I don't really know what we were expecting, but I was in awe of how orderly everything was and how many people were there waiting to be fed. And then comes this handful of people with tables, containers of food, drinks, napkins, forks, the works. Everyone knew exactly what to do and in minutes, after announcements and prayer, the food was severed.

We talked with Angel and April as we had a chance to. They were running in so many directions. People knew them and wanted and needed to talk with them. It was decided that we would hand mats out only to people that April and Angel sent to us. They knew who was sleeping on the street. We did as they ask us to and in the course of doing this we met a lady named, Linda Lou.


While talking with Linda she said something to me and Mary Lou that at first we did not understand. She said we were like gramms. We said gramms? She said, "Ya, you know, Gramms, when you are a kid, everyone has one". Then she gave us each a hug. It touched our hearts that she felt that in bringing the mats we were giving a gift to her that a grandmother would think of.

Before leaving that evening Linda asked us if we could pray together and of course we said yes. Our group got into a circle with Linda Lou and she led us with the most heartfelt prayer, it touched all of our hearts and opened my eyes. Here is a street person with nothing to call her own but a few things she has with her and she knows the Lord. She had to; she opened her prayer with Father God as so many of us do. That led me to who are these people living on the street and know our Lord so well. I discovered they are you and me. The ones, who for some reason did not make it over that poverty line, who may have illness that caused their decline, loss of loved ones, chemical abuse, and so many other things. Things that many of us have gone through, but because of financial ability, love of family and church we have been able to hang on to a life "off the streets".

Upon leaving that area that September night I knew positively that the Lord had put this ministry on my heart. There was no way that I could walk away and leave my sisters and brothers behind......they need us as much as we need them. We need them to keep us grounded in our Savior's words and not to ever think that "it will never be me on that cold street". Blessings to you, Janice Mixell
